Executive First Suites to LAX

Starting June 1, Air Canada will offer your clients travelling Executive Class a gift of travel, by operating a B76X aircraft featuring Executive First Suites on select flights.

This aircraft will be used on AC 791 leaving Toronto at 09:10 and AC 792 leaving Los Angeles at 12:40.

New for San Francisco

Also starting June 1, Air Canada is adding one more frequency Toronto – San Francisco, operated with A319 aircraft offering Executive Class and Economy Class. AC 737 will depart Toronto at 08:00 to arrive in San Francisco at 10:26. Then AC 738 will depart San Francisco at 11:15 to arrive in Toronto at 19:05.

Air Canada offers the most non-stop flights Toronto – Los Angeles with up to 28 weekly flights in each direction, and the most non-stop flights Toronto – San Francisco, with up to 35 weekly flights in each direction. All flights offer complimentary In-flight Entertainment featuring audio-video on demand from gate to gate.

Baggage Allowance Restored for US-Bound Flights



Changes to carry-on luggage restrictions have been announced by Canada's Transport Minister John Baird for flights to the United States.

Effective April 8, passengers travelling to the US are permitted to bring two carry-on bags and personal items.

"The Government of Canada is unwavering in our commitment to implement the most effective measures possible for a safe and secure aviation system, while upholding a level of comfort and convenience for air travelers," said Baird. "With more robust air security measures in place for passengers, we are able to remove the temporary carry-on baggage restrictions put into place following the December terrorist attack."

Passengers are reminded to check with the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority (<http://www.catsa.gc.ca>) or their airline for items that are allowed in carry-on luggage.
